Current Assistant Coach/Goalkeeper Coach at Boston University, Jessica just completed her second year on staff. A former standout student-athlete for the Terriers in goal from 2000-2004, she is responsible for training the Terrier Goalkeepers among other coaching duties. The 2003 America East Goalkeeper of the Year, Jessica was a member of three America East All Conference Championship Teams. She is the holder of the NSCAA National and Advanced National Diplomas.

### **ADVANCED PROGRAM GOALS**

The Advanced Program is intended for players who have a strong foundation in goalkeeping. Goalkeepers enrolling in this session should be high school varsity, ODP or premier club level players.

The objectives of this program are:

- ✓ To provide a highly competitive and demanding training environment
- ✓ To reinforce the basic technical, tactical, physical components of goalkeeping
- ✓ To use these building blocks to develop advanced technical abilities and tactical awareness.

### **INTERMEDIATE PROGRAM GOALS**

The Intermediate Program requires players to have some proficiency in basic goalkeeping skills. This program will work to reinforce these skills and build the player's confidence in the goal.

- ✓ Technical – catching, high balls, diving, shot stopping, breakaways, distribution
- ✓ Tactical – starting position, angle play, positioning, crosses, 1v1 situations, distribution
- ✓ Physical – footwork and agility

### DIRECTOR BIO

ALEX GALLAGHER (Nobles '90) is entering his eighth season as Head Coach of the Girl's Varsity basketball team. Gallagher has amassed a record of 155 - 42 in his first eight years including six consecutive ISL Championships. Prior to coming to Nobles, Gallagher spent six years as the Head Boys Coach at Weston High School. During his time there, Gallagher won three league titles and one State Championship and was named Boston Globe Coach of the Year in 1998. Gallagher was also the Head Assistant Coach at Stonehill College, Director of the Weston Wildcat Basketball Camp for four years and the Director of Hoop Mountain Basketball School for four years.

### PROGRAM GOALS

The camp will have a dual focus. There will be intense fundamental skill work throughout the day. Ballhandling, passing, shooting form and individual offensive moves will be the foundation of morning drill stations and defense / team offensive concepts will be the foundation of the afternoon drill stations. The campers will begin each day with a skill-based lecture from local High School Head Coaches. Each camper will also take part in two competitive games per day against peers of similar skill level. In the end we hope that Nobles Basketball Campers have fun, learn and push themselves to achieve dramatic improvement during the course of the week. The camp is geared towards competitive Middle School and High School Girls Basketball players.

## Outstanding Facilities

The Nobles Specialty Programs are fortunate to have access to incredible facilities. The programs are located on the 187 acre campus of the Noble and Greenough School in Dedham which abuts the Charles River.

In addition to 8 outdoor fields, four pools, two gyms, the Omni Fieldhouse, and access to many classroom spaces, we also use our new state of the art Performing Arts Building including use of Vinik Theater, scene shop and green room, a painting studio, photo lab and dark room.



## Health & Medical Information

Massachusetts State Law requires each camper to have a physical, as well as a current record of immunization, by his/her physician. Nobles Specialty Programs require each camper to have a physical within 12 months of arrival to camp. We must have completed forms in our files at the time your child registers for camp, including the most recent physical exam. **All camp health forms MUST accompany registration materials.** All forms are available at [www.nobles.edu/specialtyprograms](http://www.nobles.edu/specialtyprograms). Updated physical exam reports must be forwarded to the camp office upon completion. There is a registered nurse and/or certified trainer on site, and many of our staff are certified in CPR and First Aid.

## Registration Procedures

All registrations are processed on a first-come first-serve basis in the order they are received. **Payment in full for each camper as well as all necessary health forms must accompany the completed registration form.** We cannot process incomplete registration forms. All forms are available on our website at [www.nobles.edu/specialtyprograms](http://www.nobles.edu/specialtyprograms). Once your registration has been processed, you will receive a confirmation of your registration. More detailed information with what to bring, what to wear, drop off/pick up procedures, and any additional information that might be necessary (specific to each program) will follow in an additional mailing in June.

## Change/Cancellation Policy

Once registration is processed, any decrease in enrollments will forfeit a \$50.00 non-refundable deposit. If the camper subsequently fails to attend, withdraws, experiences incomplete attendance for any reason, or is dismissed, no refund, transfer of any deposit or tuition paid will be made after May 25, 2010.

Camper bring their own picnic lunch and snacks to camp. Water is available throughout each day. No refrigeration is available.
